SUMMARY PLAN DESCRIPTION

INTRODUCTION

The Board of Trustees of the City of Umatilla Municipal Police Officers' Retirement Trust Fund is pleased to present this booklet which briefly explains the provisions of your Police Officers' Pension Plan. As a participant in the plan, you are included in a program of benefits to help you meet your financial needs at retirement, or in the event of disability or death.

This booklet can assist you in preparing for your retirement and financial future. If you need further information on any of the topics presented in this booklet, please contact any member of the Board of Trustees. They will either answer questions you might have to help you understand your benefits or otherwise get you an answer to your questions. We urge you to read and understand this booklet in order to become familiar with the benefits of the plan and how they contribute to your financial security and how they will enrich your retirement years.

The information presented is only a summary of the pension plan ("Plan") as provided in the ordinances of the City of Umatilla. If there are any conflicts between the information in this booklet and the Code of Ordinances of the City of Umatilla, the Code of Ordinances shall govern. The provisions of this Summary Plan Description shall not constitute a contract between the Member and the Board of Trustees. The Plan shall be administered in accordance with state and federal law, notwithstanding any provisions in this booklet or ordinances to the contrary. A copy of the Ordinance establishing the Plan can be obtained from the City Clerk's office, which is located at 1 South Central Avenue, Umatilla, Florida 32784.

Retirement Trust Fund

1. BOARD OF TRUSTEES AND PLAN ADMINISTRATION

A. Administration.

- (1) The City of Umatilla Municipal Police Officers' Retirement Trust Fund is a defined benefit pension plan administered by a Board of Trustees which acts as the administrator of the Plan. The Board consists of five Trustees, two of whom shall be legal residents of the City who are appointed by the City Council, two of whom are Members of the Plan who are elected by a majority of the Police Officers who are Members of the Plan and a fifth Trustee who is chosen by a majority of the first four Trustees. Each Trustee serves a two year term.
- (2) DROP participants can be elected as but not vote for elected Trustees.
- B. The names and addresses of the current Trustees are attached to this Summary Plan Description as Exhibit "A." The Chairman of the Board is designated as agent for the service of legal process.

2. ELIGIBILITY FOR PLAN MEMBERSHIP

Each person employed by the Umatilla Police Department as a full-time Police Officer becomes a member of the Plan as a condition of his employment. All Police Officers are therefore eligible for plan benefits as provided for in the Plan document and by applicable law.

3. PLAN BENEFITS

All claims for benefits under the Plan shall be made in writing to the Board.

- A. <u>Normal Retirement Eligibility</u>. You are eligible for retirement upon the attainment of age 55 and the completion of 10 years of credited service or the attainment of age 52 and the completion of 25 years of credited service.
- B. <u>Amount of Normal Retirement Benefits</u>. The amount of the normal retirement benefit is based on your credited service and average final compensation:

"Credited Service" is generally your period of employment as a Police Officer in the Police Department measured in years and parts of years. Credited service will include credit for for a break in employment for military service, pursuant to conditions provided for under state or federal law (i.e. the Uniformed Services Employment and Reemployment Rights Act "USERRA"), provided that you are reemployed within 1 year of discharge under honorable conditions. Additional credited service time may also be available (See subsection K. below).

"Average Final Compensation" is 1/12 of your average salary of the 5 best years of the last 10 years of credited service prior to your termination, retirement or death. A year is defined as 12 consecutive months.

"Salary" is the total compensation for services rendered to the city as a police officer reportable on your W-2 form plus all tax deferred, tax sheltered, or tax exempt items of income derived from elective employee payroll deductions or salary reductions. For credited service earned after July 1, 2011, Salary shall not include more than 300 hours of overtime per calendar year and shall also not include payments for accrued unused sick or annual leave. Provided however, in any event, payments for overtime in excess of 300 hours per year or accrued unused sick or annual leave accrued as of July 1, 2011 and attributable to service earned prior to July 1, 2011, may still be included in Salary for pension purposes even if the payment is not actually made until on or after July 1, 2011. In any event, with respect to unused sick leave and unused annual leave accrued prior to July 1, 2011 or the actual amount of sick or annual leave time accrued on July 1, 2011 or the actual amount of sick or annual leave time for which the retiree receives payment at the time of retirement, regardless of whether the amount of sick or annual leave was, at some time prior to

retirement, reduced below the amount on July 1, 2011.

The normal retirement benefit is calculated by multiplying 2.5% times years of credited service for each year of credited service earned on or before September 30, 2019 times your average final compensation: (2.5% x CS x AFC= normal retirement benefit for credited service earned on or before September 30, 2019). The normal retirement benefit for each year of credited service earned on or after October 1, 2019 is calculated by taking those years of credited service and multiplying that by 3.0% times your average final compensation: (3.0% x CS x AFC = normal retirement benefit for credited service earned on or after October 1, 2019).

Normal and early retirement payments will commence on the first day of the month coincident with or next following your last day of employment. Early retirees may defer the commencement of benefits. The benefit is paid to you for your life, but you or your beneficiary shall receive at least 120 monthly benefit payments in any event.

- C. <u>Early Retirement</u>. You are eligible for early retirement upon the attainment of age 50 and the completion of 10 years of credited service.
- D. <u>Amount of Early Retirement Benefits</u>. The amount of the early retirement benefit is calculated in the same manner as for normal retirement and is available as follows:
 - (1) Beginning on the date on which you would have qualified for normal retirement; or
 - (2) Beginning immediately upon retirement, but if beginning immediately, the amount of the monthly benefit is reduced by 3% for each year by which commencement of benefits precedes your normal retirement date.
- E. <u>Supplemental Benefit Share Plan</u>. Pursuant to Florida law, a separate member "share account" has been created for each member of the Plan. This supplemental benefit may or may not be funded and thus, you may or may not receive a retirement benefit from the Share Plan. If the Share Plan is funded, at retirement, termination (vested), disability or death, there shall be an additional benefit paid to you. The Share Plan is funded solely with state premium tax money and the funding that is received for this Share Plan is allocated to your share account based on a formula which gives you an allocation based on your years of credited service. Your share account receives its proportionate share of the income or loss on the assets in the Plan.
- F. Other Retirement Options. At retirement, certain additional options are available as follows:
 - (1) Optional Forms of Retirement. In lieu of the amount and form of retirement income payable under normal and early retirement, you may elect to receive a retirement benefit in a different form so long as the form you elect is of equal actuarial value as the normal benefit. The optional forms of benefits which are available are:
 - (a) A retirement income of a monthly amount payable to you for your lifetime only.
 - (b) A retirement income of a modified monthly amount, payable during the joint lifetime of you and a joint pensioner and following the death of either of you, 100%, 75%, 66 2/3% or 50% of such monthly amount payable to the survivor for his or her lifetime.

- (c) If you retire prior to the time at which social security benefits are payable, you may elect to receive an increased retirement benefit until such time as social security benefits shall be assumed to commence and a reduced benefit thereafter in order to provide, to as great an extent as possible, a more level retirement allowance during the entire period of retirement.
- (d) If you do <u>not</u> participate in the DROP, you may also elect to receive an initial lump sum payment equal to 10%, 15%, 20% or 25% of your accrued benefit with the remaining 90% 85%, 80% or 75%, respectively, payable in a form selected by you and provided for in (a), (b) or (c) above or in the normal form (10 years certain and life).

(2) <u>Deferred Retirement Option Plan (DROP)</u>.

- (a) If you become eligible for normal retirement, and are still employed by the City as a Police Officer, you have the option of "retiring" from the pension plan but continuing your employment as a Police Officer for an additional five years. An election to participate in the DROP constitutes an irrevocable election to resign from the service of the City not later than 5 years from the commencement of DROP participation. You must request, in writing, to enter the DROP.
- (b) Upon entering the DROP, your retirement benefit is immediately calculated and each monthly benefit payment is deposited into your DROP account. Your account earns an investment return approximately equal to the other assets of the Fund. You could experience losses as well as gains.
- (c) At the time of termination of employment at the end of the DROP period, you will receive your account balance in a lump sum and you will also begin receiving your monthly retirement benefit.
- (d) Once you enter the DROP, you are no longer eligible for disability or pre-retirement death benefits, nor do you accrue any additional credited service. Your retirement benefit is fixed as of your entry date. You pay no member contributions to the plan once you enter the DROP.
- (e) Participation in the DROP is not a guarantee of employment and DROP participants shall be subject to the same employment standards and policies that are applicable to employees who are not DROP participants.
- (f) Additional information about the DROP can be obtained from the Board.

- G. <u>Disability Retirement</u>. You are considered disabled when you become totally and permanently unable to perform useful and efficient service as a Police Officer. A written application is made to the Board for a disability pension and the Board receives evidence of the disability and decides whether or not the pension is to be granted. If the pension is granted, the benefit amount shall be:
 - (1) If the injury or disease is service connected, a benefit equal to two and one-half (2.5) percent of average final compensation, for each year of credited service earned on or before September 30, 2019, and three (3) percent of his average final compensation, for each year of credited service earned on or after October 1, 2019, but in any event the minimum amount paid to the member shall be forty-two (42) percent of the average final compensation of the member.
 - (2) If the member has at least ten (10) years or more of credited service and the injury or disease is not service connect, a benefit equal to two and one-half (2.5) percent of average final compensation for each year of credited service earned on or before September 30, 2019, and three (3) percent of average final compensation for each year of credited service earned on or after October 1, 2019.

<u>Eligibility for disability benefits</u>. Subject to subsection (4) below, only active members of the Plan on the date the Board determines entitlement to a disability benefit are eligible for disability benefits.

- (1) Terminated persons, either vested or non-vested, are not eligible for disability benefits.
- (2) If a member voluntarily terminates his employment, either before or after filing an application for disability benefits, he is not eligible for disability benefits.
- (3) If a member is terminated by the City for any reason other than for medical reasons, either before or after he or she files an application for disability benefits, he or she is not eligible for disability benefits.
 - (4) The only exception to [subsection] (1) above is:
- a. If the member is terminated by the City for medical reasons and he or she has already applied for disability benefits before the medical termination; or
- b. If the member is terminated by the city for medical reasons and applies within thirty (30) days after the medical termination date.

If either [subsection] (4)a. or (4)b. above applies, the member's application will be processed and fully considered by the board.

Your disability benefit terminates upon the earlier of death, with 120 payments guaranteed, or recovery. You may, however, select a "life only" or "joint and survivor" optional form of benefit as described above under "Optional Forms of Retirement".

Any condition or impairment of health caused by hypertension or heart disease resulting in death or total and permanent disability is presumed to have been suffered in the line of duty unless the contrary is shown by competent evidence; provided that you have successfully passed a physical examination on entering into service and there is no evidence of the condition at that time.

For conditions diagnosed on or after January 1, 1996, if you suffer a condition or impairment of health that is caused by hepatitis, meningococcal meningitis, or tuberculosis, which results in total and permanent disability, it shall be presumed that the disability is in the line of duty, unless the contrary is shown by competent evidence as provided for in Section 112.181, Florida_Statutes; provided that the statutory conditions have been met.

To receive disability benefits, you must establish to the satisfaction of the Board that such disability was not occasioned primarily by:

- (1) Excessive or habitual use of any drugs, intoxicants or narcotics.
- (2) Injury or disease sustained while willfully and illegally participating in fights, riots or civil insurrections or while committing a crime.
- (3) Injury or disease sustained while serving in any branch of the Armed Forces.
- (4) Injury or disease sustained after your employment as a Police Officer with the City of Umatilla shall have terminated.
- (5) Injury or disease sustained while working for anyone other than the City and arising out of such employment.

As a disabled pensioner, you are subject to periodic medical examinations as directed by the Board to determine whether a disability continues.

<u>Death Before Retirement</u>. If you die prior to retirement from the Police Department, your beneficiary shall receive the following benefit:

- (3) Prior to Vesting or Eligibility for Retirement. If you were not receiving monthly benefits or were not yet vested or eligible for early or normal retirement, your beneficiary shall receive a refund of 100% of your accumulated contributions.
- (4) <u>Deceased Members Vested or Eligible for Retirement with Spouse as Beneficiary</u>. If you die and, at the date of your death were vested or eligible for early or normal retirement, your spouse beneficiary shall be entitled to a benefit as follows:
 - (a) If you were vested, but not eligible for normal or early retirement, your spouse beneficiary shall receive a benefit payable for 10 years, beginning on the date that you would have been eligible for early or normal retirement, at the option of your spouse beneficiary. The benefit shall be calculated as for normal retirement based on your credited service and average final compensation as of the date of your death and reduced as for early retirement, if applicable. Your spouse beneficiary may also elect to receive an immediate benefit, payable for 10 years, which is actuarially reduced to reflect the commencement of benefits prior to your early retirement date.
 - (b) If you were eligible for normal or early retirement, your spouse beneficiary shall receive a benefit payable for 10 years, beginning on the first day of the month following your death or at your otherwise normal retirement date, at the option of your

spouse beneficiary. The benefit shall be calculated as for normal retirement based on your credited service and average final compensation as of the date of your death and reduced as for early retirement, if applicable.

- (c) Your spouse beneficiary may not elect an optional form of benefit, however, the Board may elect to make a lump sum payment.
- (c) Your spouse beneficiary may, in lieu of any benefit provided for above, elect to receive a refund of your accumulated contributions.
- (d) If your spouse beneficiary commences receiving a benefit, but dies before all payments are made, the remaining benefit shall be paid to the estate of the spouse beneficiary.
- H. <u>Deceased Members Vested or Eligible for Retirement with Non-Spouse Beneficiary</u>. If your beneficiary is not your spouse, the benefits payable to your non-spouse beneficiary are the same as those to a spouse beneficiary, however, the date of commencement of those benefits may be required to be earlier, with the resulting reduction in the amount.
- I. <u>Termination of Employment and Vesting</u>. If your employment is terminated, either voluntarily or involuntarily, the following benefits are payable:
 - (1) If you have less than 10 years of credited service upon termination, you shall be entitled to a refund of the money you have contributed or you may leave it deposited with the plan.
 - (2) If you have 10 or more years of credited service upon termination, you shall be entitled to a monthly retirement benefit. The benefit shall be determined in the same manner as for normal or early retirement and shall be based upon your credited service, average final compensation and the benefit accrual rate as of the date of termination. The benefit shall be payable to you starting at your otherwise normal or early retirement date, provided you do not elect to withdraw your contributions and provided you survive to your otherwise normal or early retirement date. If you do not withdraw your accumulated contributions and do not survive to your otherwise normal or early retirement date, your designated beneficiary shall be entitled to a benefit as provided herein for a deceased member, vested or eligible for retirement under Death Before Retirement.

The Internal Revenue Code provides that certain eligible lump sum distributions from the pension plan may be directly rolled over into qualified individual retirement accounts, annuities or certain other pension plans. A 20% withholding shall be required on taxable portions of such lump sum distributions not directly transferred to a new custodian.

- J. <u>Reemployment After Retirement</u>. Any retiree who is retired under this Plan, may be reemployed by any public or private employer, and may receive compensation from that employment without limiting or restricting in any way the retirement benefits payable under this Plan. Notwithstanding the previous sentence, reemployment by the city shall be subject to the limitations set forth in this section.
 - 1. After normal retirement. Any retiree who is retired under normal retirement pursuant to this Plan and who is reemployed as a police officer after that retirement and, by virtue of that reemployment, is eligible to participate in this Plan, shall upon being reemployed discontinue receipt of benefits. Upon reemployment, the retiree shall be deemed to be fully vested and the additional credited service accrued during the

subsequent employment period shall be used in computing a second benefit amount attributable to the subsequent employment period, which benefit amount shall be added to the benefit determined upon the initial retirement to determine the total benefit payable upon final retirement. Calculations of benefits upon retirement shall be based upon the benefit accrual rate, average final compensation, and credited service as of that date and the retirement benefit amount for any subsequent employment period shall be based upon the benefit accrual rate, average final compensation (based only on the subsequent employment period), and credited service as of the date of subsequent retirement. The amount of any death or disability benefit received as a result of a subsequent period of employment shall be reduced by the amount of accrued benefit eligible to be paid for a prior period of employment. The optional form of benefit and any joint pensioner selected upon initial retirement shall not be subject to change upon subsequent retirement except as otherwise provided herein, but the member may select a different optional form and joint pensioner applicable to the subsequent retirement benefit.

- 2. Any retiree who is retired under normal retirement pursuant to this Plan and who is reemployed by the city after that retirement and, by virtue of that reemployment is ineligible to participate in this Plan, shall, during the period of such reemployment, continue receipt of benefits during any subsequent employment period.
- 3. After early retirement. Any retiree who is retired under early retirement pursuant to this Plan and who subsequently becomes an employee of the city in any capacity shall discontinue receipt of benefits from the Pln. If by virtue of that reemployment, the retiree is eligible to participate in this Plan, the retiree shall be deemed to be fully vested and the additional credited service accrued during the subsequent employment period shall be used in computing a second benefit amount attributable to the subsequent employment period, which benefit amount shall be added to the benefit determined upon the initial retirement to determine the total benefit payable upon final retirement. Calculations of benefits upon retirement shall be based upon the benefit accrual rate, average final compensation, credited service and early retirement reduction factor as of that date and the retirement benefit amount for any subsequent employment period shall be based upon the benefit accrual rate, average final compensation (based only on the subsequent employment period), and credited service as of the date of subsequent retirement. The amount of any death or disability benefit received as a result of a subsequent period of employment shall be reduced by the amount of accrued benefit eligible to be paid for a prior period of employment. The optional form of benefit and any joint pensioner selected upon initial retirement shall not be subject to change upon subsequent retirement except as otherwise provided herein, but the member may select a different optional form and joint pensioner applicable to the subsequent retirement benefit. Retirement pursuant to an early retirement incentive program shall be deemed early retirement for purposes of this section if the member was permitted to retire prior to the customary retirement date provided for in the system at the time of retirement.

(4) After disability retirement.

(i) Subject to paragraph (ii) below, any retiree who is retired under Ord. Section 2-388, disability ("disability retiree"), may, subject to the physical examination requirement, be reemployed by any public or private employer, and may receive compensation from that employment without limiting or restricting in any way, the retirement benefits payable under this Plan.

- (ii) Any disability retiree who subsequently becomes an employee of the city in any capacity, except as a police officer, shall discontinue receipt of disability benefits from the system for the period of such employment.
- (iii) If a disability retiree is reemployed as a police officer, his disability benefit shall cease and section 2-388(e) shall apply.
- (5) Reemployment of terminated vested persons. Reemployed terminated vested persons shall not be subject to the provisions of this section until such time as they begin to actually receive benefits. Upon receipt of benefits, terminated vested persons shall be treated as normal or early retirees for purposes of applying the provisions of this section and their status as an early or normal retiree shall be determined by the date they elect to begin to receive their benefit.
- (6) DROP participants. Members or retirees who are or were in the deferred retirement option plan shall, following termination of employment after DROP participation, have the options provided for in this section for reemployment.
- K. Additional Credited Service. In addition to credited service actually earned in the employment of the Police Department, you may also receive credited service as follows:
 - (1) "Buy-Back" for Prior Police Service. The years or fractional parts of years that you previously served as a Police Officer with the City of Umatilla during a period of previous employment and for which period accumulated contributions were withdrawn from the plan shall be added to your years of credited service provided that within the first 90 days of your reemployment you pay into the plan the withdrawn contributions with interest.
 - If, after 90 days from your reemployment you have failed to purchase credited service pursuant to the previous paragraph or if you served as a full-time paid Police Officer for any other municipal, county or state law enforcement agency in the State of Florida, you will receive credited service only if:
 - (a) You contribute to the plan a sum equal to:
 - the amount that you would have contributed to the plan, based on your salary and the member contribution rate in effect at the time that the credited service is requested, had you been a member of the plan for the years or fractional parts of years for which you are requesting credit, plus an additional amount to be determined by the Board's actuary so that there is no cost to the plan in giving you the additional years of credited service, plus
 - (ii) the amount charged by the actuary for determining the amount you must contribute.
 - (b) Multiple requests to purchase credited service may be made at any time prior to retirement.
 - (c) Payment of the required amount shall be made within 6 months of your request for credit, but not later than your

- retirement date, and shall be made in one lump sum payment upon receipt of which credited service shall be given.
- (d) The maximum credit under this subsection for service other than with the City of Umatilla shall be 5 years of credited service and shall count for all purposes, except vesting and eligibility for not-in-line of duty disability benefits. There shall be no maximum purchase of credit for prior service with the City of Umatilla and such credit shall count for all purposes, including vesting.
- (e) In no event, however, may credited service be purchased pursuant to this subsection for prior service with any other municipal, county or state law enforcement department if such prior service forms or will form the basis of a retirement benefit or pension from a different employer's retirement system or plan.
- (f) In addition to service as a Police Officer in this State, credit may be purchased in the same manner as provided above for federal, other state, county or municipal service if the prior service is recognized by the Criminal Justice Standards and Training Commission within the Department of Law Enforcement, as provided under Chapter 943, Florida Statutes, or you provide proof to the Board that such service is equivalent to the service required to meet the definition of a Police Officer.
- (2) "Buy-Back" of Time Lost Due to Absences Authorized by the Family and Medical Leave Act. If you are absent on unpaid leave under the Family & Medical Leave Act, you may purchase lost credited service by making an actuarially determined contribution to the plan, such that there is no cost to the plan in allowing such credited service, within strict time periods provided for in the plan document.
 - "Buy-Back" for Military Service Prior to Employment. The years or fractional parts of years that you serve or have served on active duty in the military service of the Armed Forces of the United States, the United States Merchant Marine or the United States Coast Guard, voluntarily or involuntarily and honorably or under honorable conditions, prior to first and initial employment with the City Police Department shall be added to your years of credited service provided that:
 - (b) You contribute to the plan a sum equal to:
 - the amount that you would have contributed to the plan, based on your salary and the member contribution rate in effect at the time that the credited service is requested, had you been a member of the plan for the years or fractional parts of years for which you are requesting credit, plus
 - (ii) an additional amount to be determined by the Board's actuary so that there is no cost to the plan in giving you the additional years of credited service, <u>plus</u>
 - (iii) the amount charged by the actuary for determining the amount you must contribute.

- (c) Multiple requests to purchase credited service may be made at any time prior to retirement.
- (d) Payment of the required amount shall be made within 6 months of your request for credit, but not later than your retirement date, and shall be made in one lump sum payment upon receipt of which credited service shall be given.
- (e) The maximum credit under this subsection shall be 4 years and shall count for all purposes except vesting and eligibility for not-in-line of duty disability benefits.
- Rollovers or Transfers of Funds to Purchase Service. In the event you are eligible to purchase additional credited service as provided above, you may be eligible to rollover or transfer funds from another retirement program in which you participate (traditional IRA, deferred compensation plan maintained by a government employer 457 plan, 401k plan, profit sharing plan, defined benefit plan, money purchase plan, annuity plan or tax sheltered annuity) in order to pay all or part of the cost of purchasing such additional credited service.
- L. <u>Contributions and Funding</u>. The City is paying the portion of the cost of the pension plan over and above your contributions and any amounts received from the state insurance rebates. You contribute 3% of your salary to the Plan. Your contribution will be excluded from your gross income for withholding purposes so you will realize income tax benefits.
- M. <u>Maximum Benefits</u>. In no event will the annual benefits paid from this plan exceed \$215,000 annually, subject to certain cost of living adjustments and actuarial reductions, under certain circumstances, prior to age 62 as set forth in Section 415 of the Internal Revenue Code.

If you began participation for the first time on and after January 1, 1980, you cannot receive a benefit in excess of 100% of your average final compensation. If you began participation prior to this date, you are not subject to the 100% limitation.

N. <u>Forfeiture of Pension</u>. If you are convicted of certain crimes (i.e. "specified offenses") listed in Fla. Stat. §112.3173, or if your employment is terminated by reason of your admitted commission, aid or abetment of these crimes, you shall forfeit all rights and benefits under the Plan, except for the return of your contributions as of the date of your termination.

i. <u>CIRCUMSTANCES UNDER WHICH YOUR PENSION CAN BE</u> <u>FORFEITED:</u>

Benefits are forfeitable pursuant to various provisions of the Florida Statutes, which provide for the forfeiture of retirement benefits of persons who are convicted of certain offenses.

Section 112.3173, Florida Statutes, requires the official or board responsible for paying benefits under a public retirement system to make a forfeiture determination when the board has reason to believe that the rights of the person under any such system are required to be forfeited pursuant to the statute.

The Florida Constitution provides:

"Any public officer or employee who is convicted of a felony involving a breach of public trust shall be subject to forfeiture of rights and privileges under a public retirement system or pension plan in such manner as may be provided by law."

The Florida Legislature has implemented this constitutional provision in section 112.3173, Florida Statutes. Subsection (3) of the statute requires that:

"[a]ny public officer or employee who is <u>convicted of a specified offense</u> <u>committed prior to retirement</u>, or whose office or employment is terminated by reason of his or her admitted commission, aid, or abetment of a specified offense, shall forfeit all rights and benefits under any public retirement system of which he or she is a member, except for the return of his or her accumulated contributions as of the date of termination."

A "specified offense" for purposes of Fla. Stat. §112.3173, includes:

- 1. The committing, aiding, or abetting of an embezzlement of public funds;
- 2. The committing, aiding, or abetting of any theft by a public officer or employee from his or her employer;
- 3. Bribery in connection with the employment of a public officer or employee;
- 4. Any felony specified in chapter 838, except ss. 838.15 and 838.16;
- 5. The committing of an impeachable offense;
- 6. The committing of any felony by a public officer or employee who, willfully and with intent to defraud the public or the public agency for which the public officer or employee acts or in which he or she is employed of the right to receive the faithful performance of his or her duty as a public officer or employee, realizes or obtains, or attempts to realize or obtain, a profit, gain, or advantage for himself or herself or for some other person through the use or attempted use of the power, rights, privileges, duties, or position of his or her public office or employment position; or
- 7. The committing on or after October 1, 2008, of any felony defined in s. 800.04 against a victim younger than 16 years of age, or any felony defined in chapter 794 against a victim younger than 18 years of age, by a public officer or employee through the use or attempted use of power, rights, privileges, duties, or position of his or her public office or employment position.

Section 112.3173(5), Florida Statutes, creates the procedure for a forfeiture determination to be made by the official or board responsible for paying benefits under a public retirement system. The statute requires that, upon receipt of notice or whenever the board "otherwise has reason to believe that the rights and privileges of any person under such system are required to be forfeited under this section," the board must give notice and hold an administrative hearing pursuant to Chapter 120, Florida Statutes, to determine whether the subject retirement rights and benefits must be forfeited. If a determination is made that such rights and privileges are required to be forfeited, the board must order the forfeiture. Orders of forfeiture of retirement system rights and privileges are appealable to the district court of appeal.

Section 112.3173, Florida Statutes, requires that "all rights and benefits under <u>any</u> public retirement system of which [the officer or employee] is a member" shall be subject to forfeiture.

O. <u>Conviction and Forfeiture: False, Misleading or Fraudulent Statements</u>. It is unlawful for you to willfully and knowingly make, or cause to be made, or to assist, conspire with, or urge another to make, or cause to be made, any false, fraudulent, or misleading oral or written statement or withhold or conceal material information to obtain any benefit from the plan.

If you violate the previous paragraph, you commit a misdemeanor of the first degree, punishable as provided in Section 775.082 or Section 775.083, <u>Florida Statutes</u>.

In addition to any applicable criminal penalty, upon conviction for a violation described above, you or your beneficiary may, in the discretion of the Board, be required to forfeit the right to receive any or all benefits to which you would otherwise be entitled under the plan. For purposes of this subsection, "conviction" means a determination of guilt that is the result of a plea or trial, regardless of whether adjudication is withheld.

P. <u>Claims Procedure Before the Board</u>. You may request, in writing, that the Board review any claim for benefits under the plan. The Board will review the case and enter a decision as it deems proper within not more than 180 days from the date of the receipt of such written request, or in the case of a disability claim, from receipt of a medical release and completed interrogatories. The time period may be extended if you agree to the extension.

The Board's decision on your claim will be contained in an order which will be in writing and will include:

- (1) The specific reasons for the Board's action;
- (2) A description of any additional information that the Board feels is necessary for you to perfect your claim;
- (3) An explanation of the review procedure next open to you which includes a formal evidentiary hearing.

4. <u>NON-FORFEITURE OF PENSION BENEFITS</u>

- A. <u>Liquidation of Pension Fund Assets</u>. In the event of repeal, or if contributions to the plan are discontinued by the City, there will be a full vesting of benefits accrued to date of repeal.
- B. <u>Interest of Members in Pension Fund</u>. At no time prior to the satisfaction of all liabilities under the plan shall any assets of the plan be used for any purpose other than for the Police Officers' exclusive benefit. In any event, your contributions to the plan are non-forfeitable.

5. <u>VESTING OF BENEFITS</u>

Your retirement benefits are vested after 10 years of credited service.

6. APPLICABLE LAW

The plan is governed by certain federal, state and local laws, including, but not limited to the following:

- Internal Revenue Code and amendments thereto.
- B. Chapter 185, <u>Florida Statutes</u>, "Municipal Police Officers' Retirement Trust Funds".
- C. Part VII, Chapter 112, <u>Florida Statutes</u>, "Actuarial Soundness of Retirement Systems" Ordinances of the City of Umatilla.
- D. Administrative rules and regulations adopted by the Board of Trustees.

7. PLAN YEAR AND PLAN RECORDS

The plan year begins on October 1 of each year and ends on September 30 of the following year. All records of the Plan are maintained on the basis of the Plan year.

8. <u>APPLICABLE PROVISIONS OF COLLECTIVE BARGAINING AGREEMENTS</u>

 $There is no collective \ bargaining \ agreement \ between the Police \ Officers \ and \ the \ City.$

9. FINANCIAL AND ACTUARIAL INFORMATION

- A. A report of pertinent financial and actuarial information on the solvency and actuarial soundness of the Plan has been prepared by the Plan's actuary, Foster & Foster, and is attached as Exhibit "B."
- B. A copy of the detailed accounting report of the Plan's expenses for the previous fiscal year is available for review upon request to the Board of Trustees.
- C. A copy of the administrative expense budget for the Plan, for each fiscal year is available for review upon request to the Board of Trustees.

10. <u>DIVORCE OR DISSOLUTION OF MARRIAGE</u>

Federal and state law provides certain restrictions regarding the payment of your pension benefits in the event of your divorce or dissolution of marriage. Immediately upon your involvement in such a legal proceeding, you should provide a member of the Board with the name and address of your attorney or your name and address if you have no attorney. The Board's attorney will then provide you or your attorney with information concerning the legal restrictions regarding your pension benefits. In addition, a copy of any proposed order must be submitted to the Board prior to entry by the court. Failure to do so may require you to pay any expenses incurred by the Board in correcting an improper court order.

11. EX-SPOUSES AS BENEFICIARY OR JOINT PENSIONER

The Florida Legislature has adopted Section 732.703, Florida Statutes. This law nullifies the designation of your ex-spouse as a Beneficiary or Joint Annuitant/ Joint Pensioner on your pension plan retirement benefits. Meaning, when an individual dies after dissolution or annulment of a marriage, a beneficiary designation which designates the spouse as a beneficiary, becomes void and the spouse is deemed to have predeceased the decedent. In other words, the divorce or annulment will result in a previous designation of the former spouse as a beneficiary being treated as if it never happened. This law went into effect on July 1, 2012 and now applies to all deaths occurring on or after July1, 2012, regardless of when the beneficiary designation was made by the member subject to any applicable exceptions listed in Fla. Stat. §732.703(4). Therefore, if you have gotten a divorce or an annulment and the Designation of Beneficiary form states that the beneficiary is your spouse and you wish for your ex-spouse to still receive your survivor benefits, in almost all instances you must submit a new designation form after the date of the divorce decree or annulment.

After July 1, 2012, if you want your ex-spouse to be a beneficiary or joint annuitant/joint pensioner for your plan benefit, you will have to make that designation AFTER the dissolution of marriage. If you currently have an ex-spouse as a beneficiary or joint annuitant/joint pensioner, and want to keep this designation, you will have to designate the ex-spouse again after July 1, 2012.

To reconfirm your <u>current beneficiary</u>, or to designate a new beneficiary, complete a new Designation of Beneficiary Form (PF-3).

To reconfirm your current joint annuitant/joint pensioner, or to designate a new joint annuitant/joint pensioner (if authorized by the current plan provisions), indicate such change on a Change or Confirmation of Designated Joint Annuitant or Joint Pensioner Form (PF-25). If necessary, the plan administrator will submit the new form to the actuary of the plan for recalculation of your benefit. There may be a charge to you to make this change. To obtain either of the above forms, or if you have any questions, please contact your plan administrator.

EXCLUSION OF HEALTH INSURANCE PREMIUMS FROM INCOME.

When you retire because of disability or have worked to the date you are immediately eligible for normal retirement (not early retirement), you can elect to exclude from income, distributions made from your benefit that are used to pay the premiums for accident or health insurance or long-term care insurance. The premium can be for coverage for you, your spouse, or dependents. The distribution must be made directly from the plan to the insurance provider using pension form PF-22 which authorizes the distribution. (This form may be obtained from your plan administrator) You can exclude from income the smaller of the amount of the insurance premiums or \$3,000.00. You can only make this election for amounts that would otherwise be included in your income.
